## Superb results at A Level!

**Congratulations** to all students who gained their A Level results this summer! The results were a credit to your hard work and commitment; collectively you set a number of new school records. Very best wishes as you now prepare to go to University. We look forward to seeing you at the Certificate Evening at Hulme Hall in December.

### Headline Figures

- New to A level results this year is the introduction of the new A\* grade. 10% of all entries were A\*. Over a quarter of all grades (28%) were A\* or A, well over half (54%) were at top grades A\*/A/B and 77% at grades A\* to C
- Every student gained at least two A Levels and 97.6% gained at least three (a record pass rate for the school!)
- 86% gained at least 4 A level passes (a record level for the school)
- The average number of UCAS points per student (where an A grade is equivalent to 120 points) was 381
- The average number of QCA points per student was 946.2 (a new record for the school)
- The average number of passes per student was 4 (the same as last year's record breaking year)
- Out of a cohort of 141 students, 121 gained 4 or more A levels; 15 students 5 or more and three gained 6
- 21 individual subjects gained 100% pass

### Notable individual achievements

In the year in which A\* grade is introduced at A Level for the first time, three students gained an astonishing 5 straight A\* grades. All three students are to take up places at the universities of Oxford and Cambridge. They are:

- Lee D Evans from Bebington (Politics, Psychology and Sociology - Trinity Hall Cambridge)
- Thomas Keningley from Bromborough (Modern and Medieval Languages - Kings College, Cambridge)
- Thomas Outram from Neston (Mathematics - Pembroke College, Oxford)

Also successful in gaining a place at Cambridge are Philip Arathoon from Ellesmere Port (Mathematics – Trinity Hall, Cambridge) and Kenneth Wiles from Spital (Mathematics – Churchill College, Cambridge).

In addition, one student gained 4 A\* grades, three students gained 3 A\* grades and 9 students gained 2 A\* grades.

Four students were successful in gaining places at Medical School. These were Michael Caerns from Heswall (University College, London); Sean Done from Great Sutton (Imperial College, London); Matthew Walker from Bromborough (Sheffield) and Sidharth Srinivas from Spital (Manchester).
