Which exam board and courses are studied at A Level?

AQA.

What skills will studying Spanish equip me with?

Self-confidence, the ability to talk about a variety of contemporary issues and extended writing and research. Also, you will enhance your analytical and critical thinking skills.

Do I need a specific grade at GCSE to access A level?

Each case is individual, but we would look for a Grade 7 at GCSE.

How is the course structured and how will it be taught?

There are 6 modules in Year 12 and 6 modules in Year 13. Like at GCSE you will access a Knowledge Organiser for each module. You will be taught through the online platform of Kerboodle and contemporary resources.

Is there a coursework component?

You will undertake an Individual Research Project (IRP) for your speaking examination (Paper 3). This will involve you researching a particular aspect of a Spanish speaking country of your choice and then presenting and discussing it in your speaking examination.

Who teaches the course?

Miss Broadhurst, Mr Hughes & Miss Lavin.

How is the course resourced?

Textbook, knowledge organisers, Kerboodle and contemporary resources. Digital copies of all the materials are also located on SharePoint.

How well do students achieve in Spanish?

Students achieve exceptionally well in Spanish largely due to their self-motivation and the relatively small class sizes.

Will I need to do a lot of independent study?

In order to accelerate your fluency, it is recommended that you make the most of your school non-contact time.

What are typical A level subject choices alongside Spanish?

Spanish genuinely goes with any subject! We have had students who have gone on to study medicine who have done A level Spanish to make them stand out from the crowd, as well as the sciences and Maths. Due to the nature of the course and the content it works well with any combination.



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Do I need to take another subject to support my study of Spanish?

How might Spanish help me in my next steps / university / career planning?
