Which exam board and courses are studied at A Level?

AQA. (this may change for 2026 due to AQA changing their specification)

What skills will studying Business equip me with?

- **Analytical Skills:** You will evaluate financial information, learn to analyze various business situations through data analysis, understand market trends.
- **Critical Thinking:** The course encourages critical evaluation of business strategies and decisions, enabling you to assess the effectiveness of different approaches.
- **Problem Solving:** You'll develop the ability to identify business problems and propose effective solutions, using logical reasoning and creative thinking.
- **Decision Making:** A Level Business teaches you how to make informed decisions based on quantitative and qualitative analysis, helping you weigh different options and outcomes.

Do I need a specific grade at GCSE to access A level?

5 in English and a 5 in Mathematics.

How is the course structured and how will it be taught?

The course is made up of 10 modules – six are covered in year 1 and four are covered in year 2.

It is taught through a mixture of practical activities, past examination questions, formal notetaking and case study work.

Is there a coursework component?

No.

Who teaches the course?

Mr C Wilson, Mrs K Byrne and Mr A Cheng.

How is the course resourced?

Students are asked to purchase a revision guide from the department for £10.

Students are also provided with lots of useful resources, namely model booklets and key terms sheets.
